Program Overview

1. Principles and Rationale

The inbound component of the PSU Integrated Student Mobility Program is designed to strengthen international student mobility by providing structured academic and experiential learning focused on Thailand. As a non-degree integrated program, it enables inbound students—particularly from AUN member universities—to gain foundational knowledge and practical insights into Thai language, culture, lifestyle, and local contexts through a combination of online learning and onsite engagement at Prince of Songkla University.

This inbound pathway directly supports and leads into the theme of the AUN Summer Camp 2026, “Taste of Southern Thailand — Connecting Cultures through Gastronomy.” Through preparatory online modules and immersive onsite experiences, students are introduced to the cultural significance of food, local wisdom, community life, and regional identity in Southern Thailand. The program allows participants to understand gastronomy not only as cuisine, but as a reflection of history, multicultural coexistence, livelihoods, and social values.

By positioning the inbound program as an academic foundation for the AUN Summer Camp, PSU creates a coherent learning continuum—from structured preparation to intensive cultural immersion—enhancing students’ engagement with the theme and deepening cross-cultural understanding. This approach strengthens PSU’s role as a host institution within the AUN network and reinforces inbound mobility as a meaningful platform for cultural connection and experiential learning through gastronomy.

2. Objectives

- 1) To promote inbound student mobility, particularly among students from AUN member universities, through a structured integrated program at Prince of Songkla University.
- 2) To enhance students’ academic skills, critical thinking, intercultural communication, and leadership through experiential and cross-cultural learning.
- 3) To deepen understanding of Southern Thai gastronomy as a reflection of local identity, cultural heritage, and multicultural society, building on PSU’s role in advancing Songkhla as a UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy.
- 4) To strengthen PSU’s internationalization and increase its visibility and engagement at the ASEAN level, particularly within the AUN framework.
- 5) To contribute to broader sustainable development objectives through education, cultural exchange, and community-based learning.

3. Benefits

- 1) Enhances academic skills, critical thinking, intercultural communication, and leadership through integrated and experiential learning.
- 2) Provides meaningful understanding of Southern Thai gastronomy as a reflection of local identity, cultural heritage, and multicultural society.
- 3) Strengthens readiness for international study, short-term exchange programs, and global career pathways.
- 4) Offers a flexible and scalable inbound mobility platform that complements existing short-term exchange and summer camp initiatives.
- 5) Strengthens academic collaboration and deepens institutional partnerships within the AUN framework.
- 6) Expands opportunities for sustained student mobility and cross-cultural exchange across ASEAN and partner institutions.
- 7) Supports Prince of Songkla University in strengthening continuous collaboration among institutions within the ASEAN University Network.

Prince of Songkla University (PSU) will provide the following to the participants:

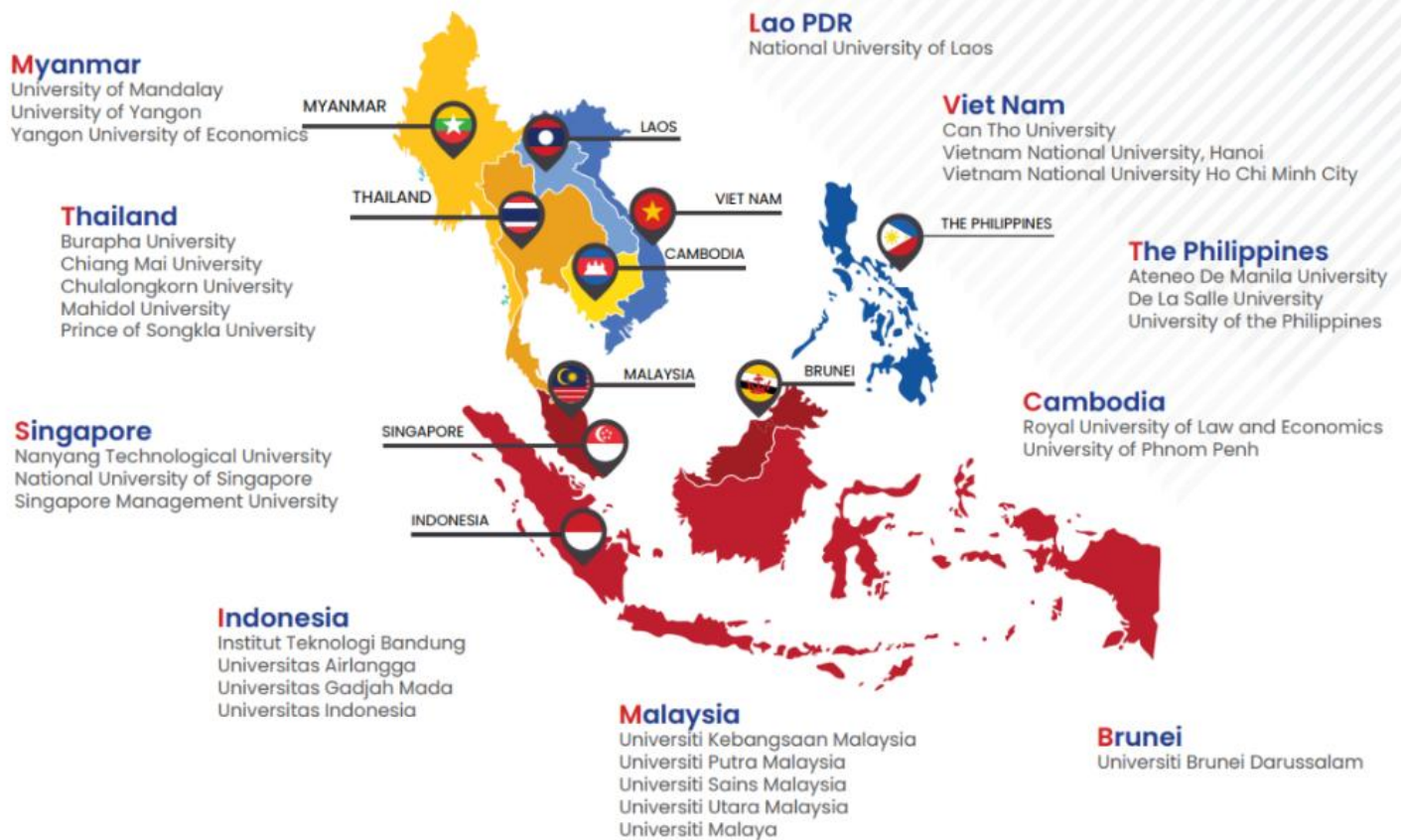

AUN30 The AUN Core Member Universities comprises of these 30 leading ASEAN universities.



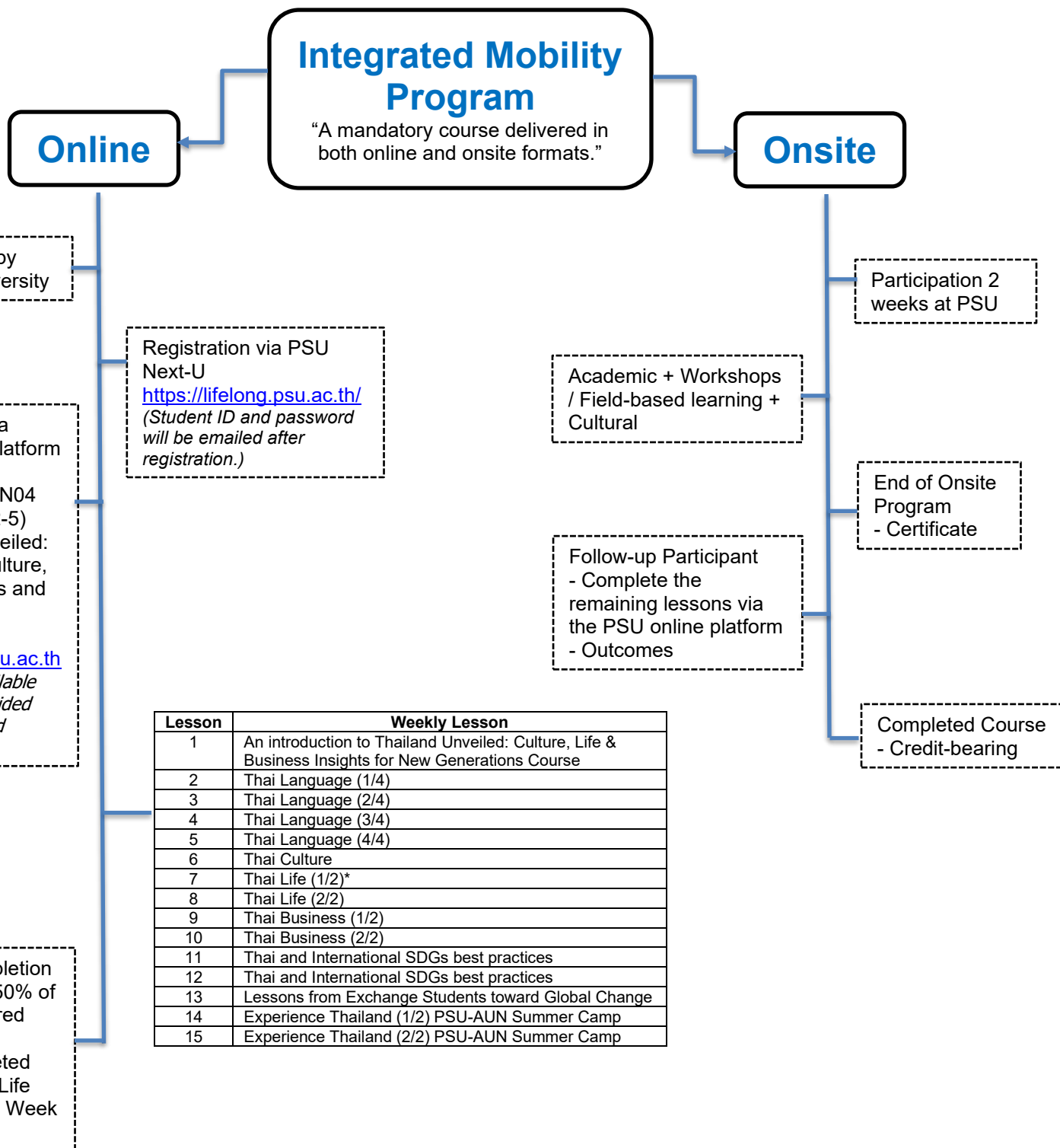
Target Participants: 2 students from each of 30 AUN Core Member Universities

4. Committed to full participation in all online & onsite program
5. Other required qualifications and nominations to be determined by each sending university.
